
## **Neck Rope Instructions**

his neck rope can be used for bridle-less riding, to help guide the horse without the bridle, or as a neck collar for doing ground work without a halter, in preparation for doing ground work at liberty. This tool is designed to be used by advanced riders/handlers and advanced horses that are skilled enough to be working at liberty from the ground or without a bridle while riding. Keep in mind that while this neck rope gives you some level of control, it does not offer the same control that you would have with a halter and lead rope or with a bridle.

This tool should only be used by qualified handlers/riders on well-trained and obedient horses.

The rider/handler assumes all risk.







## Riding Bridle-less

A. Tie a large loop (see instructions on back) in the neck rope, making sure it is tied through the leather breakaway so that the leather piece will break if the horse gets entangled. Put the rope over the head and adjust the loop so that it is comfortable around the base of the horse's neck— not snug but not too loose— and not hanging down and interfering with his shoulders.

**B.** Secure the long leather end to your saddle while not in use. When you are ready to use, loosen the leather holder from your saddle and pick up the loop as if it were reins. Use the neck rope to stop and steer as needed. Moving the rope up higher on the neck, toward the head, will give you more control.
